# ABA THERAPY THROUGH TRICARE

A step-by-step guide for TRICARE enrollees



### **HOW TO ACCESS SERVICES**

RECEIVE DIAGNOSIS

See your primary care provide

See your primary care provider for an evaluation or a referral

ENROLL IN EFMP AND ECHO
 Active duty families have 90 days to enroll in EFMP and ECHO from the date of diagnosis.
 \* Mandatory to receive ABA

## ABA REFERRAL FROM DIAGNOSING PROVIDER

Your primary care provider or diagnosing provider must submit a referral for ABA. Depending on the region, the referral must include:

TRICARE East: DSM-5 form and diagnostic report TRICARE West: DSM-5 form, diagnostic report, and attestation form

#### **FIND AN ABA PROVIDER**

Do your homework, don't rely solely on TRICARE to find a provider. Seek out local facebook groups or look up local providers in your area. Schedule an appointment for evaluation.

#### **COMPLETE OUTCOME MEASURES**

The ABA provider will complete a Pervasive Developmental Disorder Behavior Inventory (PDDBI). The ABA provider may also complete the Vineland Adaptive Behavior Scales, Social Responsiveness Scale, and Parent Stress Assessments.

#### **ABOUT THE ACD**

The TRICARE Comprehensive Autism Care Demonstration (ACD) covers applied behavior analysis (ABA) services. Under the ACD, ABA services are authorized to target the core symptoms of autism spectrum disorder (ASD). It is currently authorized to run through Dec. 31, 2023.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

To qualify for the ACD, your child must be:

- Enrolled in a TRICARE health plan
- Diagnosed with ASD by an approved provider



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
